COME TO ME, AND REST

Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. -Matthew 11:28

January is cold and dark. After the rush and brightness of Christmas, there is a quieting that settles in for many of us. And as I attempt to pay attention, to myself, to our congregation, and to the world around me, what I noticed was this: people are tired (and not just those of us caring for newborns!).

People are tired of being told they are not good enough. People are tired of being lonely. People are tired of thinking they can, and must, “do it all”.

I see new parents feeling guilty for taking a nap. I see professionals feeling weak for taking a sick day. I hear the constant refrain that there just is not enough time to get everything done. I witness burnout all around me in colleagues, friends, and neighbors. We are tired of the never ending “breaking” news. We are tired of violence. Tired of the hate. Tired in ways that run deeper than even a good night’s sleep can fix.

And to those of you who are weary. To those of you feeling let down or heartbroken. To those of you carrying exhaustion in your bones. To those of you carrying the weight of generations. To those of you who are tired. Jesus says, “Come to me and rest.”

Jesus does not demand of us as the world does. He does not add more to-do lists or expect you to prove your worth through productivity. Instead, Jesus has already completed the most difficult work on the cross. He walks with you through valleys you cannot navigate alone and brings you to the Father when you have nothing left to give.

Jesus doesn’t offer a prescription for becoming the perfect Christian. He gives gifts of grace, mercy, forgiveness, and community. And he gives these freely for the sake of the world he loves. Jesus does not overlook how tired you are. He sees you, *all* of you, and invites you to come and rest.

This January, the calendar at Epiphany is a little lighter as I ease back into ministry following my leave. But it is also intentionally lighter out of the deep desire that the people of Epiphany might rest. Even in the church, we too often believe that busy is better; that faith must always look like doing more.

This winter season, may you know that rest is not a failure of faith, it is an act of trust. May you find rest for your body and soul, the kind of rest that only Jesus can give.
